Expedition:

This week in EYFS the children were hooking into Case Study 2! The children were busy exploring the question 'What happens when we plant a seed?' The children have been getting creative making their product and building planters together for our outdoor area!

In key stage 1 we have been finishing off our science case study and writing fantastic descriptions of the setting in our Anchor text 'The green Ship'. These have been so impressive. The children have also planted some cress this week so that we can watch it grow, which links back to the basic needs of living things, which we have studied within our science case study.

Year 3/4 enjoyed family learning this week where we dissected lilies to see all of the different male and female reproductive parts. We also drew some beautiful lilies and tested our plant knowledge on Kahoot. Thank you to all the adults who could join us!

Crew:

In Crew this week EYFS crews are talking together to share how to be safe online. The children are having fun creating posters and are reflecting on the stories shared.

In key stage 1 we have continued our e-safety learning as we need all of the children to understand the importance of keeping themselves safe online. We have also been looking at the fantastic statistics that the children have been creating on TTRockstars.

In Year 3/4 we enjoyed the E-Safety drop down day this week! We looked at the benefits of using the internet but also at how we can find the right balance between screen and non-screen time. We also looked at digital kindness and knowing who we can turn to for support if something online is worrying us.





In Year 5/6 this week sees us bring to a close case study 2. The children have demonstrated excellent recall relating to famous civil rights movements. Our work has culminated in children writing new reports based on the story of Rosa Parks.
