

Expedition:

Character Growth (Crew):

EYFS have been drafting their artwork for their final product wildlife board that will be unveiled at the celebration of learning. The children have been focussing on how to make their work better using critique and have collated many facts linking to their animal of choice.

KS1 have been learning all about Martin Luther King as part of Black History Month. They have researched information about him and have written some fantastic speeches this week! They have been working hard on their reading too and have done work that is linked to Rosa Parks and Martin Luther King and have answered questions about them.

Y3/4 have been enjoying Case Study 2 this week looking at how Doncaster developed as a result of the Romans. We were really interested to learn about Doncaster originally being called Danum and we looked at pictures of the remains of Doncaster's Roman fort. We have also looked at why the Romans settled in Doncaster near the River Don!

EYFS have been exploring kindness this week as part of the NSPCC Kindness challenge! The children have created crew artwork, learnt a new crew song and have thought carefully about their stewardship roles within the classrooms

KS1 have been talking about how to be kind to each other. We celebrated how kind we already are but we also thought about how we could be kinder to each other in the dinner hall and in the playground. We have also learnt about the Windrush generation and were upset to find out that people in England were unkind to the migrants from the Caribbean after World War 2. We are very lucky to have such sweet and caring children at Green Top.

Y3/4 have enjoyed our kindness week this week! We have looked at ways in which we can be kind to each other and ways that we have been kind in the past. We have also continued our learning around The Windrush Generation as part of Black History Month. We have researched the author Floella Benjamin who wrote Coming To England and have enjoyed learning about her bravery, resilience and her amazing achievements
