Can you make something to solve a problem? e.g. a bridge for a toy to cross a river, a boat for a toy to sail across the water, steps for your toy to reach a shelf.	Can you build a tower and label the bricks with numbers? What if you had one more/less brick - how many now?	Can you draw pictures/write sentences to retell a familiar story? If you want to you could make up your own story!	Can you remember where you live? What is your house number and street name? What town do you live in? Where do your family members live?
