



	Expedition	Crew
	EYFS children have explored past and present job roles such as a baker and life before the supermarkets! The children have immersed themselves into these roles in provision; baking, working in the role play shop and even sign writing! The children are preparing for their Celebration of Learning next week.	In Crew this week the children have revisited one of our learning aliens 'Curious Cleo' and have considered how they can find out more and ask questions in their play and learning moments. The children have added new Crew norms to their Crew trees and are working on showing these as a Crew.
	Key stage 1 have been writing their final touchdown for this case study. We have been writing our own stories based on 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley' and it has helped us to understand different ways to protect ocean animals from rubbish within their habitats.	In crew this week in KS1 we have been enhancing our reading areas, in light of World Book Day so that the children fully enjoy reading for pleasure. They are looking so much betterI am so impressed with everyone's efforts!
	Year 3/4 have started their final touchdown writing stories about April and Bear from The Last Bear. I've been so impressed with everyone's enthusiasm to make their stories the best that they can be! Year 3 have also enjoyed exploring friction in expedition this week and have measured how far a car travels on different materials.	Year 3/4 enjoyed their first Community Crew assembly in a while! It was lovely to celebrate everyone's achievements and our Crew champions! We've also loved celebrating World Book Day and working hard to improve our reading areas!
	In expedition lessons we have continued to explore the qualities that a mixed-media of watercolour and ink offers. The children have combined the two to make visually interesting pieces based on Thorne North train station. Alongside this, we have begun our extended writing for our product. Each class has been assigned a different part of our historical study. This work will contribute to our presentation of learning and the leaflet we are crafting.	This week has seen our older children spend time reflecting on their year so far. Children have had an opportunity to share their learning, critique their quality and craftsmanship and make pledges for the rest of the year.
