Expedition:

The EYFS Children have begun their journey into the first case study of the spring term expedition 'See how things grow' The children will be exploring and answering the question 'How does my body grow?' This week the children have welcomed in a baby and toddler to notice development milestones and have also enjoyed a family learning session to keep their bodies and minds healthy.

In key stage 1, we have been very excited about our new expedition. We have been reading a new poetry book called 'Yuck and Yum' and we have been appreciating the artist Dennis Wojtkiewicz and the artwork he has created of fruit. We also had a go and did a shared write of our own poems using rhyming words. What a great week!

We have had a hands-on and engaging week in Y3/4 this week. The children have absolutely loved exploring electrical circuits, experimenting with bulbs, buzzers, motors and switches. We added extra cells to our circuits to see how this changed the efficiency of the components. It has been great to work as scientists and conduct practical experiments!

Crew:

In crew sessions this week the EYFS children have developed their love of reading in Friday Crew. It has been so wonderful seeing how many children are reading at home and are excited to read the shared reader of the week.

In crew this week, years 1 and 2 have been discussing reading and how important it is that they read their reading books every week. We have gone through the new routine of reading and when we change books and everyone is excited to get started.

Y3/4 have unpicked their individual Accelerated Reader data and discussed the importance of what the data told us. When then made pledges based on what we could get better at. Additionally, Crew Dutton, Taylor and Overson have undertaken stewardship duties this week, taking part in some litter picking and general tidying around the school grounds.





Parent Information

NHS Pharmacy First Service

Did you know that the NHS Pharmacy First Service enables children and adults to get convenient access to healthcare advice and treatment where appropriate, for seven common conditions without the potential delay of having to wait for a GP appointment?

Accessing the service may mean that can help children feel better and back to school as quickly as possible, as well as supporting parents/carers to also get better if they are unwell with one of the conditions covered under the service.

There is no need to make an appointment; parents or carers can pop into their local Boots pharmacy with their child and ask for help under the service.

Support for the following conditions can be accessed under the service, free of charge (unless NHS prescription charges apply):

Common condition	Patient eligibility
Earache	1 to 17 years
Impetigo	1 year and over
Infected insect bites and stings	1 year and over
Sore throats	5 years and over
Sinusitis	12 years and over
Uncomplicated urinary tract	Women 16 to 64 years
Shingles	18 years and over

Most pharmacies can help you with seven common conditions without needing a GP appointment



- **Sinusitis** (adults and children aged 12 years and over)
- Sore throat adults and children aged 5 years and over)
- Earache (children and young adults aged 1 year to 17 years)
- Infected insect bite (adults and children aged 1 year and over)
- **Impetigo**
- (adults and children aged 1 year and over)
- Shingles (adults aged 18 years and over)
- Urinary tract infection
