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Expedition:	Crew:
This week the EYFS children are sharing their product designs with each other and admiring their beautiful work in preparation for their presentation of learning. The children are also learning to sequence and retell the story of Jack and the Beanstalk.	The EYFS Crew this week have explored the character trait of respect. The children have thought carefully about different faiths and beliefs and how we can all help the world if we understand this more.
In expedition this week, KS1 have been learning how to stay healthy by eating a balanced diet and doing exercise.	In KS1 crew this week, we have thought about our mental wellbeing and about how we can help ourselves if we are feeling lonely. The children had some great ideas.
In year 3 and 4, children have grappled with animal classification; we have also started to look into the human digestive system and the purpose of teeth. This work has built our background knowledge so that we can confidently use the key facts to write reports for our final product.	In year 3 and 4 we have explored ways in which we can stay safe online. Now that many things are accessed digitally, it is important we consider ways in which we can help ourselves be as safe as possible.
Year 5/6 have been working hard on their artwork this week sketching portraits of Rosa Parks, Martin Luther King Jr and Emmeline Pankhurst. They have drawn the images in the style of the Little People Big Dreams illustrators and have completed multiple drafts which have been critiqued by their peers.	Year 5/6 have focused on learning about loneliness this week and thinking about how we can help ourselves and others that feel lonely. Year 6 also spent the day at Crucial Crew learning valuable life skills to keep themselves safe as they start to get ready to transition to secondary school.





Parent Information

NHS Pharmacy First Service

Did you know that the NHS Pharmacy First Service enables children and adults to get convenient access to healthcare advice and treatment where appropriate, for seven common conditions without the potential delay of having to wait for a GP appointment?

Accessing the service may mean that can help children feel better and back to school as quickly as possible, as well as supporting parents/carers to also get better if they are unwell with one of the conditions covered under the service.

There is no need to make an appointment; parents or carers can pop into their local Boots pharmacy with their child and ask for help under the service.

Support for the following conditions can be accessed under the service, free of charge (unless NHS prescription charges apply):

Common condition	Patient eligibility
Earache	1 to 17 years
Impetigo	1 year and over
Infected insect bites and stings	1 year and over
Sore throats	5 years and over
Sinusitis	12 years and over
Uncomplicated urinary tract	Women 16 to 64 years
Shingles	18 years and over








Most pharmacies can help you with seven common conditions without needing a GP appointment



- Sinusitis
- (adults and children aged 12 years and over)
- Sore throat (adults and children aged 5 years and over)
- Earache (children and young adults aged 1 year to 17 years)
- Infected insect bite (adults and children aged 1 year and over)
- Impetigo (adults and children aged 1 year and over)
- Shingles (adults aged 18 years and over)
- Urinary tract infection (women, aged 16 to 64 years)
