Absences If your child is absent you must contact school everyday informing the reason your child is absent. If we don't hear from you daily this could trigger a safe & well homevisit. School drive is for parents with passes only. If you are collecting your child because they are ill you are able to use the drive otherwise you must walk into school to collect or drop your children in school. This includes any children arriving late, if this is the case you will be politely declined entry. Late Marks - School starts at 8.30am and this is the time all children should arrive at their classroom doors. If your child arrives late after doors close at 8.40am they will be given a Late Mark 'L' on their attendance record. Help your child's crew earn as much Kitty as possible by ensuring they are in school every day.





Expedition:

The EYFS children have begun case study three and answering the question 'How can the Big Bad wolf say sorry?' This week the children have delved into the story and had lots of fun retelling it!

In key stage 1 this week, we have continued our work on David Attenborough but we have focused more on places that he has been to whilst filming one of his programmes. We chose Africa and watched videos and used our senses to explore the beautiful continent. We spent a lot of time looking at the savanna and the animals that lived there. Then we have written a descriptive setting description, which I am really proud of. The vocabulary and expanded noun phrases that the children used were fantastic!

This week in Expedition, Year 3/4 have been busy developing their scientific understanding of sound and how it works. We kicked off our learning by exploring the concept of vibrations—discovering that all sounds begin with something that vibrates. We learned how these invisible movements travel through the air and into our ears as sound. To bring our learning to life, we became scientists and carried out a series of hands-on experiments to investigate how pitch can be affected by different materials. From tightening strings to tapping glasses filled with water, we tested our ideas and carefully recorded what we observed. We compared how high or low the sounds were and thought about why different materials made different sounds.

This week, Year 5 have continued to be engaged in their expedition all around mining whilst Year 6 have been working hard on preparing their final word presentations. The Year 6 children are reflecting on their journey's through Green Top thinking about their character growth, academic success and beautiful work. These presentation will be shared with the adults over the next coming weeks which we are excited for!

Crew:

In Crew this week, the EYFS children have been engaged in a range of meaningful learning experiences. They took part in an interactive online video call focused on drowning prevention, where they learned important ways to stay safe near water. The children were excellent at identifying potential hazards and impressed us with their confident and thoughtful responses to the questions posed during the session. As part of our learning about British Values, we explored the concept of Mutual Respect and Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs. This tied in with our learning about Judaism, where the children showed curiosity and respect as they discovered more about this world religion and its traditions.

In crew this week in key stage 1, we joined an interactive online video call about drowning prevention. We learnt about ways to stay safe near water, which we all agreed was extremely important because of the canal we have in Thorne. The children were very good at spotting hazards and it was great to hear that lots of the children can already swim...amazing work!

This week in Crew, Year 3/4 have been deepening their understanding of the Judaism religion. As part of our RE learning, we explored some of the most well-known stories from the Jewish faith. Working in small groups, each Crew was given a different story to read, discuss, and bring to life. Together, we learned about four important stories from Judaism, thinking about the key messages and values behind them. The children showed great curiosity and respect while learning about another faith, and we are proud of how confidently they shared their knowledge. Another great example of Crew working together to learn and grow!

In Y5/6 crew this week, we have had lots of learning opportunities which have included developing our knowledge of Judaism, learning about how to keep safe around water, and deepening our knowledge of British Sign Language. We have also enjoyed listening to Stevie Wonder each morning as part of our welcome to the day activity and learnt how inspirational he is!




