Identification of students	<p>The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 students who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of Key Stage 2.</p> <p>In 2015 -2016, the expected standard was a Level 4 in reading and maths.</p>	
Action 1	<p style="text-align: center;">Appropriate Curriculum</p> <p>An additional Skills Based Curriculum (SBC) Group was set up in Year 7. This group was taught SBC for 12 out of 50 periods per fortnight.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Appropriate teaching groups/sets</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Quality First Teaching.</p> <p>A primary trained teacher and the SENDCO deliver the Skills Based Curriculum to this particular group with an emphasis on integrating literacy and numeracy skills into the lessons.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">The primary trained teacher taught Mathematics to one set of students.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Effective use of student data to inform planning to meet individual learning needs.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">‘Challenge for All’ was the pedagogical and C.P.D. focus for 2015/16</p>	<p>Cost Staffing £12,500</p>
