QUALIFICATION: London Institute of Banking and Finance
Level 2 Financial Education Certificate (LiFC)

Overview of the Course

The LiFC will give you a good understanding of money and finance and will provide valuable insight into a range of career opportunities within the financial services sector, while giving guidance on methods for enhancing your employability skills. The LIBF Level 1 / Level 2 Lessons in Financial Education Certificate (LiFC) is an accessible e-learning programme which will allow you to experience financial education on a 'learning by doing' basis. The programme is intended to be supported by teachers in delivery albeit with you working through the programme on your own. By studying the LiFC, you will engage with finance-specific knowledge and understanding by relating it directly to your own personal financial decision-making. You will also be provided with an insight into a range of career opportunities, within the financial services industry and other industries, and how to apply for a job. The LiFC is registered as a Level 1 / Level 2 qualification, which aims to recognise learner achievement across the qualification.

Who is this qualification for?

This course is run in conjunction with

- Btec L2 Workskills
- Btec L3 Enterprise and Entrepreneurship

All three courses run for one year in Year 12 and are designed for students to prepare for the world of work by applying for apprenticeships or staying on to complete other level 3 courses in Year 13.

What does the qualification cover?

- Unit 1 Your Personal Finances
- Unit 2 Money Management for Your Generation
- Unit 3 Your Future, Your Career

This qualification equips you with the knowledge to cope confidently and effectively with basic financial encounters you are likely to meet. You will develop knowledge and understanding of spending and how to become competent at managing your own money. You will also explore various careers within the financial services industry.

What could this qualification lead to? Will the qualification support progression to further learning, if so, what to?

This qualification is a precursor to understanding your personal finance and future financial well-being.

Will the qualification lead to employment, if so, in which job role and at which level?

It also enables you to become aware of the range of career opportunities available in the financial services sector.

You can progress to higher level 3 finance qualifications with the London Institute of Banking and finance that may lead to a career in financial services and banking.
