

It has been notable that our community has been outstanding in this pandemic. I am proud to be part of it.

throughout this process. We could not be prouder! Students will now move to twice a week home testing. Further details can be found by clicking here.












PE Department

In addition, Bronwyn Walker, Conner Stacey, Grace Perks and Betty Wood all worked hard in their lessons, whilst Mollylouise Hemmings, Kianna Welsh, Georgina Freier, Ellie Bick, Alicia Grange, Blake Creamer, Riley Woolams, Luke Adams and Holly Yates also worked diligently in school and made some absolutely fantastic contributions!

Ashlee Smith and **Aidan Pritchard** attended their Eloquence groups without fail, reading aloud some trick articles which broadened their vocabulary - well done to both of you!

Moving forward, now we are back in school together, Eloquence Groups are resuming face to face as we read aloud and discuss articles on topical issues from news headlines such as racism, technology and human rights. Launching this term, the Champion's League will put teams of students against each other to score goals in the form of academic achievements. Students first met on Monday 22nd March to formulate a team name, create a logo and discuss tactics. Goals are collated at the end of each week to decide the weekly winner, with each weekly win counting towards the prize for the overall winners for the year!

Ultimately, both our staff and our students are pleased to take one step closer towards normality and we have worked together over what has been a very testing period. But I'd also like to express my sincere gratitude to the parents of Rednock School for their boundless support in these difficult times - without you, the last two months simply wouldn't have been possible.













Science Department



Mr Steele's Year 7 class (7R3) have been looking at the propagation of sound waves and wanted to know how fast sound travels. In order to investigate this 7R3 knew they could make use of an equation learnt before Christmas: speed = distance / time. The goal then, was to measure the time it took for a sound to travel a known distance.

The first challenge was to find a large enough distance that the class was able to observe a delay in sound travelling, this meant making use of the football pitches. Students organised themselves into groups to collect the data; with some students measuring the distance the sound travelled and others measuring the time it took for the sound to travel and some coming together to make some very loud noises!

The class managed to spread themselves out over 165 m, and the average time measured for the soundwave to travel was 0.58 s. Plugging these numbers into our equation meant the class was able to calculate that the speed of sound in air was 284 m/s. When the class googled the true value for the speed of sound, they found that it is approximately 340 m/s. The rest of the lesson was spent discussing why the value didn't match up with the true value and how they could have improved our experiment to get a more accurate result.








We are pleased to announce the relaunch of Rednock's Careers website called 'Destinations'.

I'm not fooled.


