GROUPING POLICY: Students have been set based on their progress and attainment last year. For each population there is a high prior attainment set, a set where students need more support and two or three sets of mixed prior attainment students.

What will my child learn?

Students will cover a range of Historic themes under the themes of Shaping the Nation – How the British Empire in America and India shaped our modern world, Evaluating World War 1, Significant events of World War 2, The Holocaust, Case Studies - the Windrush and its impact and 9/11 and its impact.

Their knowledge of the historical topics will be developed as well as the historical skills of causation, significance, change and continuity, interpretations and sources.

What will homework look like?

Extended Learning Projects, literacy homework, including reading tasks, mini research tasks and consolidation of classroom work will all be used on a regular basis. Homework will be set through Satchel One.

Fieldwork days for each population will be confirmed as they are planned, local opportunities around the school site or local area will be utilised where appropriate. If available national competitions, guest speakers and charity links will be pursued.
