Year 10 have done a great job and should be really proud of their efforts. We include pictures of some of their fantastic work below.





### **Drama Department**





#### **Science Department**





# Bespoke Andy Lewis MBE Visit to Rednock Bespoke



On Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> March, paratriathlete Andy Lewis MBE made a special visit to Rednock School to hold a mental health-focussed 'Mentoring Masterclass' for our Year 8, Year 9 and Year 10 students.



Andy's Story: In 1999, at the age of 16, Andy lost his leg in a horrific bike accident when a 38-tonne lorry ran him over. After the accident, everybody told Andy there were things that he wouldn't be able to do following his leg amputation. Andy was in a very dark place but he soldiered on gaining his pilot's licence before flying solo across Europe. Andy became a paralympian competing in the triathlon; he won the gold medal at Rio 2016, becoming British, European and

World Champion. Andy was awarded an MBE from the Royal Family in 2017.

Andy has used his life experiences and

adversities to create a powerful message, raising aspirations and helping people tackle their problems so they don't have to go through the struggles that he did. During the masterclass, Andy talked to the students about his highs and lows, including his success in sport but also his mental health and nearly losing his wife and children by pushing himself to the limits. Andy is a true inspiration; the students found the masterclass both moving and extremely motivational.

Vanessa was energetic, motivational and inspiring and shared some really important messages with students around resilience, mindset and mindfulness. As part of our focus on the home-school partnership she also delivered excellent presentations to both teachers and parents / carers to help triangulate the message between the students, staff and home.
