Returning Students

It's lovely to see the school full of students again after the summer break. We've loved hearing what they all got up to over the holidays and it seems like everybody has managed to relax and recuperate! They've all returned with a fresh mind ready for learning and we're excited to see what the year ahead brings.



What should students be aiming for in this term?

In Term 1, the main aim is to get students settled into school and to be happy and confident about coming here each day. By the end of the term they should know their way around the school, have met all their teachers and started to settle into the routine of their timetable.

Once students have had their first IT lesson, they will have access to the school's computer systems, including 'Edulink' which tracks their progress and attendance and 'SatchelOne', which is where homework is set.

How can I help as a parent/carer?

At the very beginning, the best things you can do are to reassure your child and to talk to them frequently about what is happening at school. The more specific your questions, the more specific the answers will be! If you have any concerns at all about your child, it is really important that you raise them with their tutor. It is MUCH easier to 'nip problems in the bud' while they are small than to let them build into something bigger.

Once your child has set up their IT accounts, you will be sent details of how to log on to and use 'Edulink' and 'SatchelOne'. It is really helpful if you can download both of these apps and check them regularly. If you are unable to access or use the apps, there will be workshops to help you with this on the October Meet The Tutor evening.


