


Achievement Heroes

Sport Science

On Wednesday 25th October, our PE A Level sport scientists had the opportunity to undertake physiological laboratory testing at the University of South Wales. Our students participated in a VO2 max test, undertook tests to measure body mass, bone density and muscle mass in a hydro static weighing pool, experience

training in a hypoxic chamber and undertook an

anaerobic max test.

The students then had lunch at the University before a series of strength and conditioning tests and lectures. This was a brilliant opportunity to put their theory into practice in top class facilities. Students found this experience really helpful, educational and gave them an insight into University life.

On the 6th November the Year 13 biologists attended the event "Biology in Action" at the University of Warwick. The students found out about the latest developments in science and the possible new careers in biology.

They really enjoyed finding out how diseases impact wildlife and ecosystems. In the lecture students were challenged to find out about the 6 degrees of separation between Californian driveways and seals dying in Hawaii!

They also attended a lecture given by Greg Foot, a science presenter and communicator. He spoke about the cutting-edge research done at the Tambopata Research Centre in Peru as well as about the impact of local gold mining and illegal logging on the rainforest. Lots of us have been inspired to visit and volunteer in the tropical rain forest and I really hope we all find a way to do it in the near future.

I would like to thank all the Year 13 biology students for their sensible behaviour and maturity shown throughout the day, Mrs Parker for having organised the trip and Mrs Gwilliam for having driven all of us there and back.






A Familiar Face!










Work of the Week - Cardiorespiratory Cakes!

Creative Writing






