# Year 11 Mock Exam Check List December 2024

Your Y11 MOCK Exam Dates are: Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> December to Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> December 2024



Please allow plenty of time for your journey to school on exam days.



You will need to be in your Tutor room by 0840 for the morning registration, then make your way to the Dining Hall for 0845 for the Exam Briefing.

For the mid-morning exams please assemble in the Dining Hall immediately after Break for an 1140 start, unless otherwise stated on your timetable. This will allow you to be briefed before being escorted to the Exam Rooms.

For the afternoon exams, please assemble promptly at 14:05 (end of Lunch) for a prompt 14:10 start to the exam.

All Exam Sessions are in the Main Hall and classrooms, as shown on your Individual **Exam Timetable.** 


Please ignore the 'Seat' column (computer generated), as ID Cards will be laid out in each exam room for each paper depending on the subject and access arrangements/medical needs.



Bags and coats should be left in Tutor Rooms/ Lockers – do not bring them to the Exam room/Dining Room.



Students must not have any potential technological/web enabled sources of information i.e. mobiles phones, watches, earpods or any other 'smart' electronic devices in their possession whilst sitting the exam.





Leave them in your locker.

ONLY Locker Keys can be left in the tray provided in the dining room. Any other items are left at the owners risk.

## **EQUIPMENT**

You will need to bring in the following equipment in a CLEAR PENCIL CASE or plastic bag:



# 2 x black ball pens (not rollerballs, gel pens or blue pens, erasable pens)

- 2 x HB pencils
- 1 x eraser
- 1 x ruler
- 1 x calculator (where allowed) NO LIDS to be brought into the exam room.
- 1 x protractor
- 1 x pair of compasses

Coloured pencils where needed

3 x different coloured Highlighter Pens

(can only be used on Question Papers NOT in your answers)

### N.B TIPPEX/CORRECTING FLUID, TAPE or PENS IS NOT ALLOWED

Do not use gel pens – this is because many of the exam papers are now scanned and sent electronically for marking – gel pens do not scan well.









- Sharpen pencils –Pencil sharpeners can only be used prior to entering the exam room.
- You may bring in a drink of water in a small, <u>clear</u> plastic bottle. Any labels must be removed. These should have a spill-proof cap.
- You may bring in sweets: these must be unwrapped and in a clear transparent bag. You must be able to eat them without making a noise.
- ALL wrist watches, ear pods MUST BE REMOVED and handed in to the invigilator or left in your locker/bag.
- You will be disqualified if you are either found to be wearing or have on your person (in pockets) a watch, air pods, headphones, ear pods, any 'smart' devices or a mobile phone.
- NO GRAFITTI ON PAPERS/DESK: an examiner can refuse to mark a paper which has been defaced.
- NO writing/ drawing on arms or hands you will be sent to wash it
  off losing exam time.
- No Bracelets or 'festival bands' on your wrists. They will need to be removed or cut off.
- CORRECTION OF MISTAKES: all crossing out should be a single line through the words e.g., incorrect
- Tie long hair back or avoid flicking it back to avoid distracting others.
- TOILET BREAKS: There will be no toilet breaks in the first hour or last 30 minutes of an exam paper. Toilet Breaks will always be allowed for medical reasons/Toilet Card holders. Please speak to the Lead Invigilator before the start of the exam if you require a Toilet Card.



#### **CALCULATORS:**

A basic scientific calculator is considered sufficient for the demands of the GCSE papers and Level 1 & 2 papers.

Calculators can be used in ALL exams unless otherwise stated on the Exam Paper Instructions.

Sshh!

There is absolutely no talking or communicating in any way between students once you enter the exam room. If you have any questions, you should raise your hand once seated and an invigilator will come to you.
