What will I learn?

In the Gold Arts Award qualification, you'll deepen your artistic and leadership skills, develop a unique portfolio, and explore a career pathway in the arts. This advanced-level award encourages you to specialise in an art form of your choice. You'll take on leadership responsibilities by planning, organising, and delivering an arts project, which strengthens your project management, communication, and collaboration skills, all of which are key skills for any workplace environment. Additionally, you'll research career and education opportunities, exploring the broader arts industry and connecting with professionals to build insight and confidence in your future.

The Gold Arts Award provides a platform for in-depth personal and professional growth, encouraging creative autonomy, self-reflection, and resilience. The experience culminates in a portfolio that showcases your journey and achievements, empowering you to make informed next steps in the world of the arts.

How will I learn?

You will learn through a series of interactively taught sessions alongside practical sessions on your chosen arts discipline. You will also be encouraged, and supported, to work independently on your personal evidence portfolio.

How will I be assessed?

- Standard control forms completed over the period of the project
- Internal assessment by teachers
- External moderation
- All coursework - no examination
- You will need to give a short oral presentation.

FAQs.

Do I have to have studied Drama at GCSE?

No! You must have an interest in the arts (photography, music, production, art, dance, drama) and be willing to develop and explore an agreed area but a formal qualification is not necessary.

Do universities care about Arts Awards?

Universities want good candidates. They want students who can think outside of the box, take the initiative, and people who have the motivation to work hard. The Gold Arts Award is designed to showcase all of these things and universities rate them very highly.

Does the Arts Award give UCAS points?

Yes, if you pass the Arts Award qualification you will get 16 UCAS points to contribute to your university application process. At Rednock we have been teaching the course for over 10 years and have an 100% pass rate.
