## Culture & Behaviour

**How?**  
Our first Achievement Heroes will be celebrated on 12/9 and it is always nice to recognise those who are nominated by their peers for kindness. There has been a lot going on in school over the summer to improve the spaces and we will reiterate how to look after their school. To support this work, we will be introducing a 'school community hero' in our achievement hero celebrations to recognise those students who work hard to respect the school environment.

**How?**  
Our Year 9 buddies will be ensuring that our Year 7s settle well into Rednock life and the 6th form student community leaders will be working with their community captains to make sure the Community Challenge is the best ever, alongside developing more community based ideas. Does your child want to try something new? Keep an eye out for more details on 2 evening social events. A 'Craft, Create and Chill' café for KS3 girls and a 5-a-side sports event for Yr10/11 boys.

**How?**  
Following collaboration from students and staff, we have consolidated the school rules, based on our iMatter values and what these look like in action. We will work with students over these first 2 terms to ensure they are all clear on the expectations: how we will reward them when they get it right and support them to do so, if needed

**How?**  
Our first challenge runs through September, with students being encouraged to aim for 95%+ attendance to be entered into our prize draw. Also, the tutor group with the highest attendance each month will win a breakfast. Our first tutor group trips to the Chantry Centre this year will also be awarded to the tutor groups with the best attendance in term 1. All students across the school, who miss less than 1.5 days and have 0 behaviour points in Term 1, will also be invited to a celebration event. Our first Golden Ticket assembly of the year will take place in Term 2, based on the value 'Motivated'. The theme of "motivated" also covers being ready to learn and we have adapted the basic equipment and uniform list. Thank you for your support in making sure your children are following these expectations.

**How?**  
As we start a new school year, we will encourage students to get the most out of their year in many ways. This may include signing up to clubs that run during and after school. Staff will also be encouraging students to use the 'What a Great One Looks Like' boards in department areas to remind them what they should be aiming for in their own work. We will also be launching our 'Things to do before you leave Rednock' to encourage students to be ambitious for themselves and their time in school.

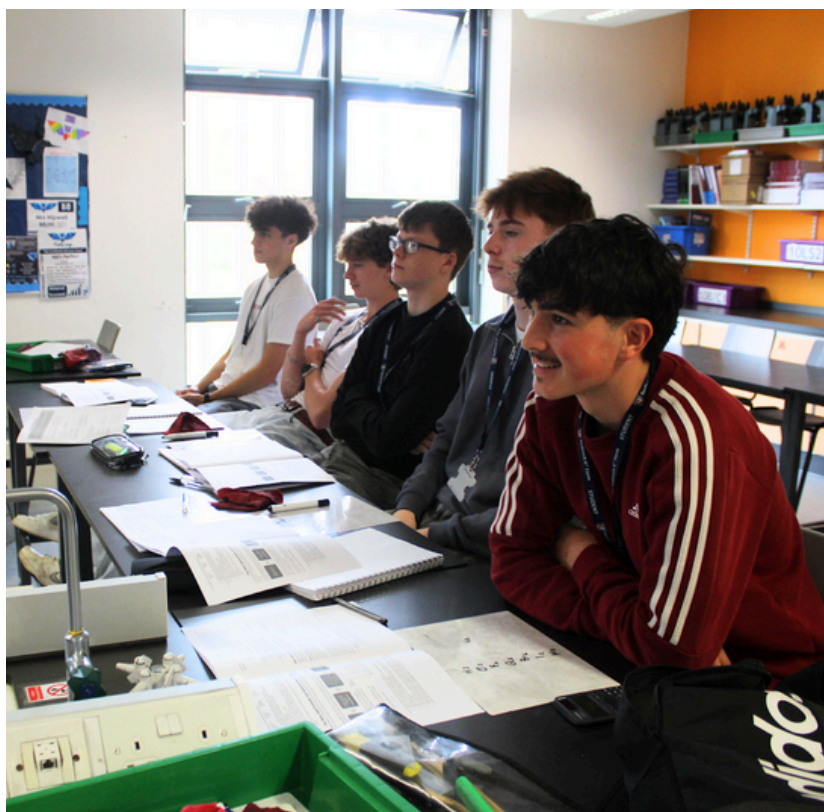




## Year 12 shine!
