# **Remote Learning**

We understand that this a challenging time for everyone and that the practicalities of home learning may be difficult for a wide range of reasons.

As you are aware, we are delivering our remote learning through Google Classroom.

If your child is not accessing Google Classroom we will contact you shortly to offer support. If you are struggling to access this and need some support, please contact school and we will do our best to help you.

For children at home, if you have not already received your work pack, you will be doing so shortly. This is to help you complete the lessons set on Google Classroom. Children who are working between home and school will not have their maths work book at home, this is because we want to avoid spreading the virus by bringing things back and forth to school.

All classes are online at 9.15am every day and this has proved very popular with the children in school who have enjoyed sending messages to their friends.

If you or a member of your family displays symptoms of COVID you must arrange a test and all members of your household need to self-isolate until you receive the results. If you test positive, people living in the same household or anyone they have had close contact with must self-isolate for 10 days. If a child tests positive, then please inform school immediately if your child has attended for up to 48hours before they displayed symptoms. We have uploaded our updated risk assessment onto the school website.

A huge thank you to all who contributed in any way to make our Christmas Fair and raffle the success it was.
