Staff Lateral Flow Testing

Staff will be continuing to test twice a week. If a staff member receives a positive result from a Lateral Flow Test, we will inform you via telephone, text or email that we have had to close a bubble/bubbles or school. Staff will then access an NHS PCR test which can take up to 72hours to come back. If this also comes back positive, then the bubble/bubbles or school will remain closed and your child will need to isolate for the full 10 days; if the PCR test comes back negative then the bubble/s or school will be reopened the following day.
