

What you need for college...






- If you have less than 8 Level Two qualifications then you may not be able to do some college and university courses.
- There isn't much difference between having 8, 9 or 10.
- The main thing that colleges, sixth forms and universities will look at is the quality of your GCSEs (i.e. the grade) - not the quantity.

Prince's Trust and Sports Leadership:

- → Level 1 or 2 award
- → Not on performance tables (so may or may not count for some courses)

Other: (Materials Technology, Cooking for Life, Creative Art and Enterprise and Marketing)

- → No qualification
- → Portfolio of excellent work you can show to employers or in interviews.



Options Guidance - Jim Example

Student tutor group: 9Ex

Compulsory subjects: Maths GCSE, English Language GCSE, English Literature GCSE, Double Award Science GCSE, Ethics GCSE and PE (not assessed)

Within your 5 options choices we recommend you select:

Level 2	Vocational
3 to 5	0 to 2

Note: Some courses are both vocational and level 2.

After making your 5 selections, you should be able to tick these boxes:

Rule	Tick
At least three of my five choices are Level 2 courses	8
No more than two of my choices are vocational courses	
At least one of my choices is either History or Geography	0

You can see which courses are suitable for each selection in your options booklet.

We encourage you to discuss your choices with your parents and individual options mentor.



Warning – subjects, even when they appear in option blocks are still not guaranteed to run. Subjects will only be taught if they have enough students opting for them to make them viable.

Will I get my choices?

- We guarantee your 1st choice
- You might not get the others

Last year:

- Roughly 90 out of 120 got their top 4 choices
- About 20 got 4 out of their 5 choices
- About 10 had to choose again as their choices did not fit

If you hand in your form late, or change your mind after handing in the form, you are much less likely to get your preferred choices

Can I change my mind?

 If you submit your form late, or ask to change it, you are less likely to get your choices as classes maybe full or certain lessons may become incompatible.

If we are able to make a change for you, we will.

 If you start year 10 and find you hate a subject we might allow changes up to the end of September but there can be no changes after that.
