As you may remember we cancelled the inset day we had planned on the 18th January. As this was the day originally scheduled for schools to reopen after the extended Christmas holiday we felt it was not the right time to hold a staff training

However, we have been hugely fortunate to secure the services of a very well regarded trainer who is going to deliver some online training on providing effective feedback to students in a time efficient way. This will help our teachers in the current remote learning situation and will also provide longer term benefit.

Therefore, there will be no remote learning set for next Wednesday afternoon. Students working at home should use this time to carry out some enriching activities such as exercise, creative tasks or something else away from their desks and screens, they could act on feedback they have received on the work they have done so far or, if necessary, catch up on any work they may have missed.

The students working in school will be free to leave (with parental permission) at 1pm. However, due to the late notice of this Inset we can supervise them in school if this is required. We are investigating what busses OCC transport can provide at these times. - My child can leave at 1pm and can make their own way home or will be collect
- 2. My child would like to catch the school bus at 1pm, please include information about which bus they catch.
- 3. My child should stay in school until their usual finish time and will then be collected/allowed to make their own way

I apologise for the late notice regarding this closure but we were only able to secure this very valuable opportunity very late in the day.
