<u>Lateral Flow Testing</u>—please ensure your child is carrying out two tests per week and registering the results both on the school form and with the NHS—more information can be found <u>HERE.</u>

Students have been given more test kits today. If your child did not collect additional test kits or has used their last test please ask them to collect additional tests from Mrs Taylor-Lane or Mr Bamford.

- DO take the LFD test twice a week and report your result whether following the instructions in your test kit.
- DO Confirm a positive LFD test result by getting a PCR test The household should start self-isolating and you should book a PCR test appointment or order a PCR test kit to be delivered to your home. If the PCR test is negative, the household can stop self-isolating
 - DON'T use the LFD test for your primary or pre-school aged children
- If they have been instructed to self-isolate as a contact of a COVID case a negative result (either LFD or PCR) will **NOT** allow your child to return to school or nursery before the end of their 10-day self-isolation period.
 - DON'T use the LFD test if your child or anyone in the household has COVID symptoms. If you, your child or anyone in the household has COVID symptoms, they must book a PCR test.



Since 1996, Quest for Learning has been helping to close the gap in literacy and numeracy between Oxfordshire's most disadvantaged primary-age children and their better-off peers. We believe that too many children are not fulfilling their academic potential through no fault of their own. The reasons for this are not easy to unpick: it may be because they arrived at school with

only limited English, they don't have much support at home, or they miss vital teaching through illness or disruption. Sometimes, they simply don't have the confidence to engage in lessons.

Whatever the reasons, two things are clear. Firstly, if these children don't catch up with their peers by the time they leave primary school, their chances of doing so at secondary school are almost non-existent. Secondly, Quest for Learning, through our carefully designed interventions and resources, can make a real difference.
