



There are many ways you can encourage your child when they are doing homework. For example, you might say:



“ I'm proud of you for sticking with it and taking the time to understand the concepts you're trying to learn. ”



If your child works hard but doesn't do well, you might say:

“ I noticed you spent a lot of time figuring out your homework – I can see you're very dedicated. Let's work together to figure out what you don't understand. ”



If your child is attempting a new challenge, you might say:

“ It looked as if you were enjoying getting to the next level ”
or
“ You seemed to be trying really hard to find the answer to that question. ”

Reinforce the positives of new learning experiences with something like:



“ Good job at trying something new and different – I know you haven't done this before. ”

If you and your child are exploring an activity, show your child that you value curiosity, intellectually stimulating conversations and the exploration of ideas.



“ When you ask questions to figure out what you're doing, I appreciate your curiosity. ”

or

“ It makes us happy that we can discuss these activities, don't you think? ”
