





Every student has their own individual “thumbprint” of their strengths and weaknesses. Students need to be aware of their own weaknesses.</p> <p>These topics can be found in “Exam Analysis” sheets that are shared with students after exams. On a more basic level, scan through the contents page of your kerboodle textbook and identify topics you have forgotten.</p> <p><b>When to revise:</b> Students need to find a time in the week where they can spend one hour a week working on these weaknesses. 

