- Use the Figure provided (eg graph/map/photo etc), ideally making 3 references
- If 6 or 9 marker, you must use the example/case study we have learnt in class
- If you need to complete a graph, you must do it in the same order as the key is given
- When shading a graph, you must use exactly the same as the key. Use a ruler if necessary.
- If you are asked to annotate/label, then your arrow must touch exactly what you are referring to.
- If you have to give a value/number, remember to include the units
