

Students progress to post 16 qualifications at a variety of local schools, colleges and apprenticeship providers.

A high number of our ex-students go on to university - a high proportion gaining places at Russell Group institutions.

Last year nine of our alumni gained places at Oxbridge.

Admissions Criteria

Langtree School Admission - Over-Subscription Criteria

In accordance with legal requirements, children who have a Statement of Special Educational Needs or an Education, Health & Care Plan naming the school will always be admitted.

If Langtree School is oversubscribed (there are more applications than places available) the following rules will be applied in descending order of priority

1. Children who are “looked after” by a Local Authority
2. Disabled children on grounds of physical accessibility
3. Children of staff
4. Children living in the designated area of the school with a brother or sister on roll at the time of application who will still be attending at the time of entry
5. Children living in the designated area of the school. If there are more applicants than places, priority will be given to those children who live closest to the school
6. Children living outside the designated (catchment) area who will have a brother or sister on roll
7. Children who attend one of our main feeder primary schools
8. Those children who live closest to the school

OCC Advice about Applying

Apply on time, ie no later than 31 October 2025.

If your application is late, it will be processed later in the year, and you are far less likely to get a place at one of your preferred schools.

You can list three different schools in order of preference.

OCC advise you to enter your catchment (or designated area) school as one of your preferences.
