



Dear Parent/Carer

December 2025

I would like to offer your son/daughter the opportunity to experience the action packed Year 7 camping trip to Youlbury Scout Activity Centre. The trip will include a wealth of exciting activities, which will develop student's self-esteem, social skills and ability to work in a team. The students will be camping under canvas in the extensive grounds of the Youlbury Scout Centre. All activities are run by either a qualified member of our staff or the Youlbury Centre instructors. Please see overleaf for a list of possible activities.

Students will be travelling by coach from Langtree on **Monday 13th July** and arriving back at school on **Friday 17th July**. A more exact time of departure and arrival home will be provided closer to the time.

I am trying my best to get this letter out as early as possible, to help parents/carers with the financial planning towards such a trip. The cost of the trip is determined by many factors, but the biggest variables are the activities, food and accommodation provided by the Scouts at Youlbury and the number of students that come on the trip. The more students that join us the cheaper we can run the trip.

In order for students to make new friends and become closer as a year group we have always tried to encourage **all students** in the year to be involved in this event, which has always been a Year 7 tradition at Langtree. This is the only trip at Langtree where we can take the whole year group and I hope your son/daughter will be a part of it in July 2025.

I have done some calculations and tried to work out the best case and worst case costs for this trip. At this point therefore I would like to ask you to sign up your son/daughter with the understanding that the cost will be somewhere between **£378.00 and £415.00**. This will include travel, 4 nights full board tented accommodation, insurance and all day instructed activities. We will let you know the final cost as soon as we know who is coming, my fingers are crossed that all students will be there, pushing the cost to £378.00.

If you would like your son/daughter to be considered for a place on this invaluable visit, please pay a non-refundable deposit of £60.00 by **Monday 26th January 2026**, and complete the consent form via SCOPAY as detailed below.

Outline of Payment Plan:

Deposit: £60 by the 26th January followed by 5 stage payments of £71 each on 25/02, 23/03, 27/04, 20/05 and the 19/06. The final stage payment will be amended if the price reduces.

Methods of payment and consent are as follows:

Please pay by credit or debit card via the school website or the SCOPAY app. **You will also give consent for the trip here**

- To do this you should go to <http://langtreeschool.com> and click on the SCOPAY icon on the front page. If you don't have your pupil link code contact finance who can give you the code. Alternatively, you can download the app from your app store once you have an account set up
- **You will be asked to give consent for your child to attend the trip on SCOPAY before you make the payment.**

If at this stage you need more time to assess the cost of the trip but would still like your child to be considered for a place, or if your child is eligible for Pupil Premium, then please contact the finance team by phoning the school or email finance@langtreeschool.com.

Registering your child on this trip represents a commitment that they will take part in this trip. Trips require extensive planning, organisation and careful costing based on the number of students participating. It is not therefore possible for students to withdraw from a trip having previously made a commitment to take part. All monies paid are on a non refundable basis as long as the trip goes ahead. The full balance of the trip must be paid prior to the trip taking place.

The school reserves the right to withdraw students from a trip when there are concerns about behaviour, attendance or attitude. The full balance of the trip must be paid prior to the trip taking place. If booking a place on this trip please take a moment with your child to go to our website and look at our [Code of Conduct](#) for trips and visits. Booking a place on this trip implies agreement with this document.

Non School Uniform Dress Code

We are justifiably proud of our extra curricula programme and the number of trips and visits we are able to offer.

The dress code for these trips/ visits is "school appropriate clothing". This is to ensure all students are safe, comfortable and can engage in all the activities we are offering. This means, students should dress professionally and appropriately.

Students are not permitted to wear any of the following:

- Very short shorts or skirts
- Crop tops or tops that leave midriffs uncovered
- Flip-flops or backless footwear, due to health and safety issues
- Excessive make up or jewellery
- Tank tops or vest tops.
- Clothing with offensive or inappropriate logos

All trips and visits involving students from Langtree School are always planned and risk assessed extremely carefully, in order to ensure the highest level of safety for our students as we possibly can.
