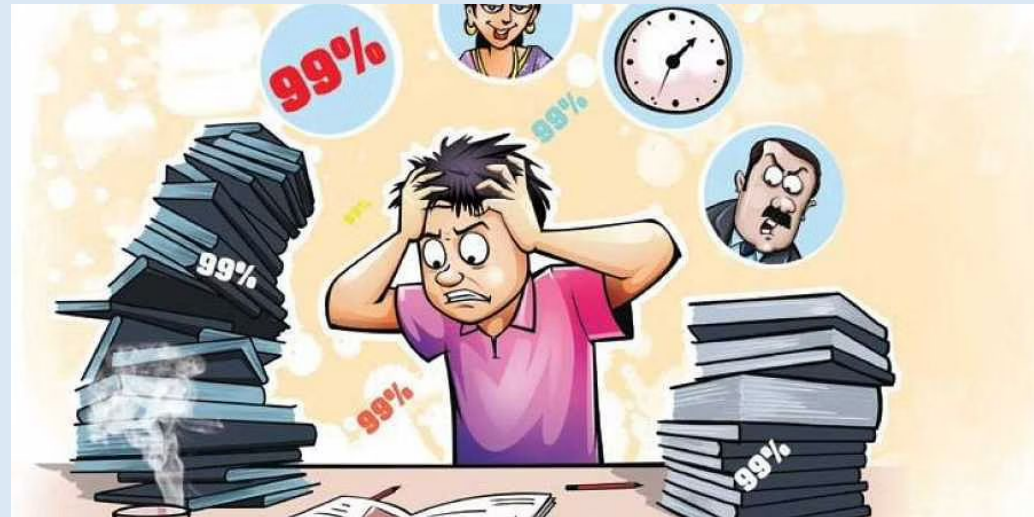

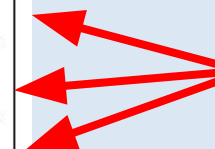
Within your 5 options choices we recommend you select:

Note: Some courses are both vocational and level 2.

After making your 5 selections, you should be able to tick these boxes:

Rule	Tick
At least three of my five choices are Level 2 courses	<input type="checkbox"/>
No more than two of my choices are vocational courses	<input type="checkbox"/>
At least one of my choices is either History or Geography	<input type="checkbox"/>



You can see which courses are suitable for each selection in your options booklet.

Warning – subjects are not guaranteed to run. Subjects will only be taught if they have enough students opting for them to make them viable.

*In this **example**, a student would not be able to take both IMedia and Cooking because they are in the same block, and not in any other block.*

Option Blocks are decided **AFTER** students have submitted their form

- This means that we can make the **best option blocks possible**, that work for the highest number of students
- This means that the option blocks will be **a disappointment for some students**.
- Due to timetable constraints, **PE and Sports Leadership will be in the same option block**. Do not choose both subjects.
- There are no other subjects that I can predict ahead of the students completing their form.

Will I get my choices?

If two subjects clash, we will give you the one you have ranked highest. This means you are very likely to get your number 1 choice unless it is over-subscribed or under-subscribed.

This year (2026) Food & Cooking are looking likely to be over-subscribed. Some students will be disappointed.

In a typical year:

- Roughly 90 out of 120 get their top 4 choices
- About 20 get their backup (choice 5) instead of one choice
- About 10 have to choose again as their choices do not fit

*If you hand in your form **late**, or change your mind after handing in the form, you are much **less likely** to get your preferred choices*

Can I change my mind?

- If you submit your form late, or ask to change it, you are less likely to get your choices as classes maybe full or certain lessons may become incompatible.
- If we are able to make a change for you, we will.
- If you start year 10 and find you hate a subject we might allow changes up to the end of September but there can be no changes after that.
