Dear Parents and Carers

We are delighted to be able to take 100 of our current Year 8 students to London's West End, to attend the matinee performance of *Hamilton* as part of their Creativity Day in November, when they will be in Year 9.

Hamilton is an award-winning, high-energy musical that has been widely acclaimed by both critics and audiences. Combining hip-hop, Broadway-inspired music, outstanding choreography, and powerful storytelling, it is regarded as one of the most influential musicals of recent years. The students have been introduced to *Hamilton* during their Drama lessons, and we are delighted that so many have expressed an interest in attending. As we have a limited number of tickets available; if demand exceeds the 100 places, we will allocate tickets through a ballot to ensure the process is fair for everyone.

Students not attending the trip will be in school; details of this provision will be provided nearer the time.

To enable this trip, we are requesting a voluntary contribution of **£38.40**. As outlined in our Charging and Remissions Policy, the trip can only proceed if the costs are covered by voluntary contributions. If your child is entitled to the Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) their contribution can be covered.

If you would like to reserve a place for your child, please complete the consent form, including entering contact details and any allergy/medical needs, via SCOPAY as detailed below. Please can you complete this information and submit the initial contribution of £20.00 by the **19th July**. The next instalment of £18.40 will then be due by the **30th of September**.

Registering your child on this trip represents a commitment that they will take part in this trip. Trips require extensive planning, organisation and careful costing based on the number of students participating. It is not therefore possible for students to withdraw from a trip having previously made a commitment to take part. All monies paid are on a nonrefundable basis as long as the trip goes ahead.

The school reserves the right to withdraw students from a trip when there are concerns about behaviour, attendance or attitude. The full balance of the trip must be paid prior to the trip taking place.

All trips and visits involving students from Langtree School are always planned and risk assessed extremely carefully, in order to ensure the highest level of safety for our students as we possibly can.

While we will continue to offer learning in 'the outdoor classroom' as we always have done so at Langtree, I would want to assure parents that we have reviewed all of our arrangements accordingly and that we will do everything in our control to ensure that all students participating on a trip can do so with a sense of safety, confidence and enjoyment.
