## **English**


In English lessons, we started the term by looking at a story called 'Young Zeus' by G. Brian Karas. Our targets during this text were to improve our vocabulary and to be able to write in detail. ## **Maths**

At the beginning of this term, we tackled the daunting task of written methods for division. We have been linking our knowledge of multiplication and times tables and learning all about the 'bus stop' method. We also learned about finding the area of rectilinear shapes, firstly by counting the squares, then by using the formula 'length X width = area.' Most recently, we have recapped what we already know about fractions, and now we are moving on to equivalent fractions, counting in fractions and converting improper fraction to mixed number fractions. Our maths brains are definitely ready for a well-deserved holiday!

## Geography

Geography lessons have been super interesting this half-term. We have been learning all about the 7 continents and 5 oceans.
