English	<p>Reading – lots of bedtime stories with discussion.</p> <p>Read Write Inc phonics on you tube. Choose a times table and see how many questions they can answer in a minute. Use the number line attached to help you. Addition – Find the biggest number on the number line then count on to find the answer. Subtraction – Find the biggest number and count back to find the answer.</p>
DT	<p>Design your own fruit kebab. Think about how you can make it colourful and which fruits you could use to give it lots of different tastes. Write a list of the ingredients you have used.</p>



	<p>If you would like to you could try to make your kebab.</p>
PSHE	<p>Look at the pictures and talk with your grown up about the questions.</p> <p>Draw a picture of someone who helps you and write a sentence about how they help you.</p>
VE Day	<p>Talk to your children about VE Day. Look at the Union Jack and ask your child to make their own.
