Go back through the book and look for any words with split diagraphs. a-e, e-e, i-e, o-e, u-e. Make a table and list the words you have found. Can you read all of these words?</p> <p>Dear Diary. I would love to know what you have been doing over the last week. Write a 'Dear Diary' entry to tell me about your favourite day. Use words such as first, then and next to help get the events of the day in the correct order. Remember your capital letters and full stops.</p>
