



Working at Home Year 1 Week beginning 15.06.20

As well as the year group booklets, the following are suggestions for different activities for the children

English	<p>Discuss with your child what a simile is. (Comparing an object to another object. E.g. A clown's nose is as red as a tomato.)</p> <p>Write a rainbow simile poem. You could either use the sheet attached or make your own rainbow sheet.</p> <p>Book Review</p> <p>Read a book with your grown up. This could be your favourite book or one you have never read before. Write a book review so your friends know if it would be a good book to read. You could answer the following questions to help.</p> <p>Title</p> <p>Author</p> <p>Which characters are in the story?</p> <p>What happens in the story?</p> <p>What is your favourite part?</p> <p>How many stars out of 5 would you give this book?</p>
Maths	<p>Counting in 2s.</p> <p>Draw around a 2p coin 3 times. Counting in 2's, work out how much you have and write it underneath. Repeat this for a variety of numbers.</p> <p>Counting in 5s.</p> <p>Cut up 12 pieces of paper and write the numbers we use for counting in 5's. (One per piece of paper)</p> <p>Spread these out on the floor. Give your child a multiplication question from the 5 times table. How quickly can they find the answer?</p>
Geography	<p>Read travelling Ted's power point about his visit to London. Talk about what the children have found</p>



	<p>out. Make a poster about London showing all of the interesting facts you have learnt.</p> <p>The end of the power point suggest you could make a London landmark of your own. I would love to see some photographs if you choose to complete this challenge.</p>
