Remember to use lots of good language and some of the expanded noun phrases from your plan.</p> <p><b>Activity 3</b> –Write a new story all about the three seagulls, Fred, Tom and Bert. You can send them on a new adventure or you can set your story near Mr Grinling’s lighthouse.</p> <p><b>Activity 4</b> – Act out your story about the seagulls. Make sure that you act just like the characters in your story.</p>

See Google Classroom for a template to help you create your bar chart.</p> <p><b>Activity 4</b> - Complete the carroll diagram activity using your times table knowledge. Please see Google classroom for the resources and a video showing you how to do it.</p>
