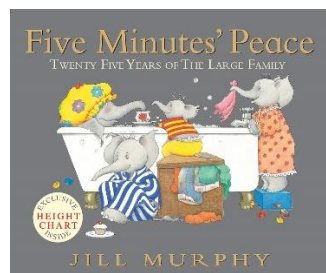


Year One- Autumn 1
