On her official birthday in June, there is an RAF flypast over Buckingham Palace. The Queen and her family watch from the balcony of the palace.

A special parade also takes place.

This is called 'Trooping the Colour'.

The Queen is saluted by over 1,400 officers.

There are also 200 horses in the parade.
