- The guidelines for the new Arts Award curriculum are easily adaptable to all pupils from EYFS to upper KS2, and can be creatively interpreted to allow all pupils of all abilities opportunity to excel in all art forms





Through the Aim@Arts program, pupils will:

Explore the Arts as a Participant

Pupils Will	Evidence
Participate in any art form	Description of Arts Activity
Discuss how to develop arts skills	Information on how they developed their participation and enjoyment in their Arts activity (eg photos, feedback, comments, video etc)
Improve personal arts skills	Summary of what pupils have learned and how skills have improved



Explore the Arts as an Audience Member

Pupils Will	Evidence
Experience of at least one arts event	Evidence of at least one arts event (eg program, postcards, photographs, CDs, DVDs)
Reflection on personal enjoyment and quality of the arts event (review)	Evidence of personal reflection on the event and its creative impact (eg written or recorded comments) eg displays around the school, Google Accounts
Participate in discussion about the event	Evidence of communicating personal reflection/sharing with one or more others (eg photographs, comments from teacher, recorded reflection, CDs, DVDs), Google Drive



Research and Investigate Artists

Pupils Will	Evidence
Undertake simple research into, and appreciation of, the work of an artist, craftsperson or arts practitioner (including	Evidence of their research (eg notes, photographs, recordings)
Document what they have learned from the research into the artist's artistic career, life and work	Summary (in any format) of what they've found out, why that person was chosen, what they learned about the artist's career, life and work



Share the Arts with others

Pupils Will	Evidence
Preparation: Share in discussion with their teacher	Exploration of their activity – ie why they chose it, planning, preparation
Delivery of skill share	Evidence of activity and how skills were shared (eg displays, performances, buddy-teaching)
Review how well it went	Reflection/Review of how it went (written or verbal (recorded))
