The winner of each category will be announced at a **gala evening on 12 March 2015**, the first day of Music Education Expo 2015, at The Grange St Paul's Hotel in central London. The evening will feature a solo piano performance from Yamaha scholar and Guildhall School of Music student Jonathan Morris, incidental music from students at Leighton Park School, and entertainment from multi-award-winning vocal group Voces 8. The evening will be presented by Classic FM DJ Margherita Taylor. The winners will be chosen by our expert panel of judges, save for the Best Classical Music Education Initiative, which will be chosen by a public vote on the Classic FM website, and the Music Teacher Magazine Editors' Award, which will be chosen by Thomas Lydon, editor of Music Teacher magazine.

Woodcroft is very quickly gaining a reputation for outstanding Arts and Music education. It is an Artsmark Gold school, an accredited Arts Award Assessment Centre and regularly participates in prominent local and national performances. The school is also a frequent host for events organised by the Barnet Music Hub in partnership with BEAT (Barnet Education Arts Trust).

Woodcroft has developed an exciting Arts and Music programme titled AIM@Arts. This was identified by Ofsted in a recent inspection as providing excellent enrichment opportunities.
