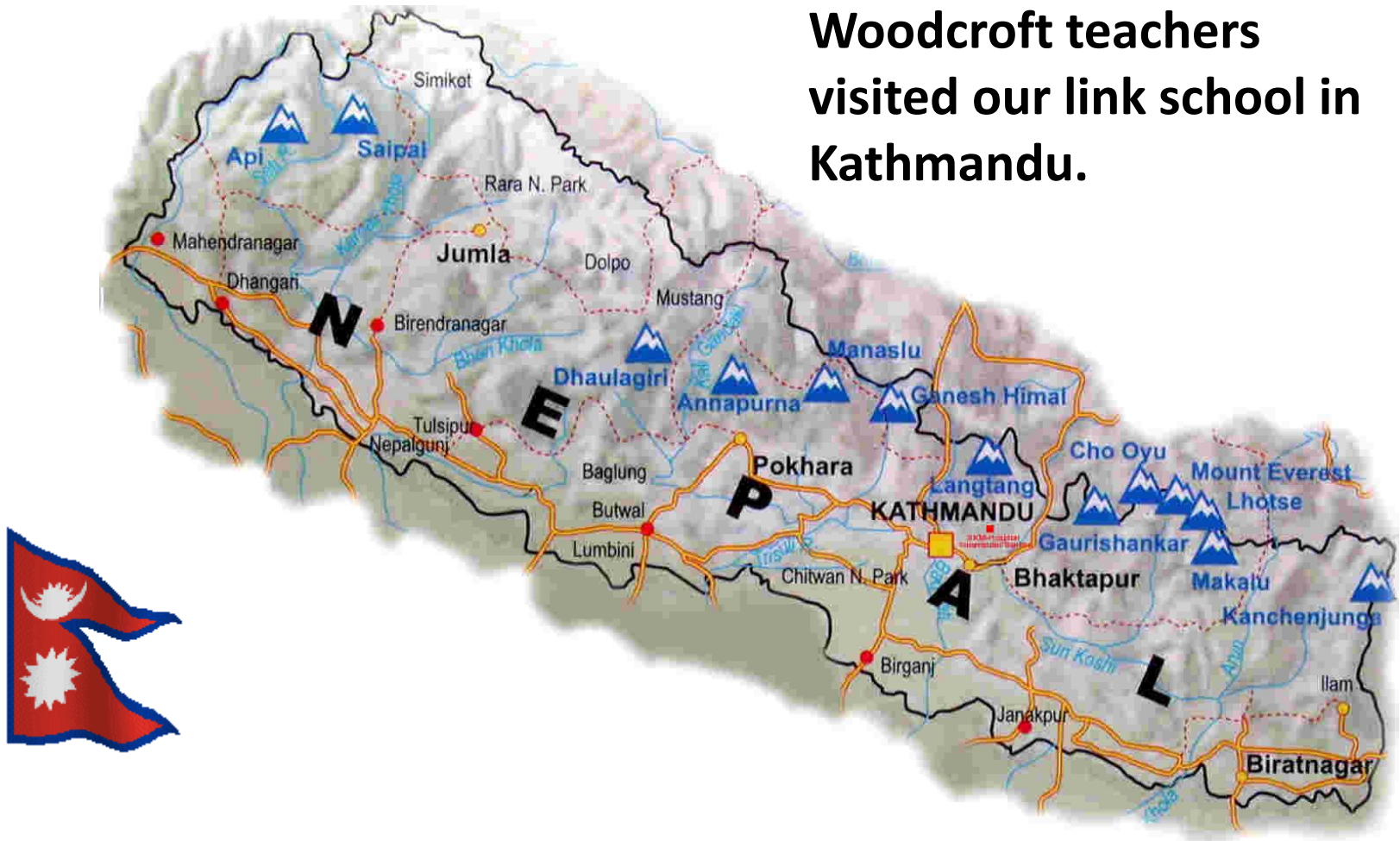


Nameste from Nepal

Patan Durbar Square

Swayambhu is an ancient Buddhist religious complex on top of a hill in the Kathmandu Valley, west of the city. It is also known as the Monkey Hill as there are holy monkeys in parts of the temple.
