<u>Maths</u>

- Understanding x,+,-:- and including mental calculations and paper/ pencil strategies.
- Money and real life problems.
- Fractions, decimals and percentages.
- Ratio and proportion.
- Handling data.
- Shape and space.
- Measures including problems.
- Making decisions and checking results.

<u>English</u>

We will be studying a range of phonics, spelling, vocabulary, grammar, punctuation, comprehension and composition through fiction, poetry and non-fiction topics.

The fiction and poetry will focus on classic tales, poetry and drama by long established authors including a novel and adaptations of classics on film/T.V.

The non-fiction work will include an autobiography and biography, diaries, journals and letters which recount experiences and events.

Students will receive a spelling list based on our Topic shortly which will be tested throughout the term.

Homework:

Up until half term the children will have 'Brain-Builder' weekly tasks to complete as well as weekly spellings to learn and spelling sentences. We also ask that the children read for 20 minutes every evening and record it in their

Homelink books which will be collected and checked every Thursday.

Science
