# Part 2. Educational Contexts

## **CONTEXT 1: Assessment Without Levels**

Assessment levels are now removed, and have been replaced with school based freedoms linked to scaled performance descriptors, new challenging tests, increased floor targets.. Governors must ensure statutory requirements are in place and school policy and practice is fit for purpose to deliver outstanding outcomes.

## **Summer Update:**

 Target Tracker assessment and target recording system successfully implemented. This uses whole school 'Bands' and 'Steps' i.e.Band two reflects national expectations for Y2. Each band is then broken down into steps (Below, Toward, Above). Teachers carried out detailed analysis of their tracking as part of June INSET Day

Government abandoned proposals to implement the 'Early Excellence' Foundation Stage Baseline
Assessment for Reception and Nursery. We are continuing to support its use in Woodcroft until the
Government provide further guidance.

#### **CONTEXT 2: Academisation**

The Government reversed its descision that all schools should become academies by 2022.

However, restricted to those schools that fail to meet the floor targets for attinment or progress. Natoinal average for combined KS2 SATs was 53%. The floor target is 85% of pupils in a school (Woodcroft 61%).

Progress expectations will not be available until December 2016

Academisation remains a central remit to the Government Agenda

ConnectED Heads discussed that this could lead to a possible expansion of connectED remit.

We are employing Paul Wiggins (Retiring Head of Barnfield) as the connectED Chair

Successful connectED Governors event took place on 16th May.

#### Reception Profile Summary

GLD has remained constant this year, at 55%, (2015-2016)

All areas have shown a lower percentage in 'Expecting' and 'Exceeding' in 2015-2016, compared to 2014-2015. Literacy and Maths 'Expected' and 'Exceeding' have continued to decrease.

#### **Year 1 Phonics Screening Check**

The school posted its best phonic outcomes: 95% passed,

Higher than the Barnet average of 81% and the national average of 80.8%.

#### **KS 1 Teacher Assessment Results**

Reading: 56% assessed as reaching the expected standard

Writing: 49% assessed as reaching the expected standard

Maths: 54% assessed as reaching the expected standard

Science: 69.5% assessed as reaching the expected standard

These scores are much lower than in the past years, however they are roughly in line with the Barnet averages, although writing is below.

#### **KS2 Results**

Woodcroft results for Maths, Writing and Grammar are above national averages. Reading is below national averages. The combined Reading, Writing and Maths is above national and Barnet averages.

# **Part 4: Ofsted Actions Update**

Woodcroft Primary School was inspected by Ofsted on 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> of December 2014. A report was published on 7<sup>th</sup> January 2015. Key areas for governors to note and track improvements are:

## 1. The quality of leadership in, and management of, the school is Good

Areas for improvement:

- Need to provide more guidance for parents about how to support pupils at home:
- Need to share outstanding practice between teachers within school more frequently
- Need to ensure milestones are included in future action plans so that governors can track progress.
   Governors must check the impact of action plans to make sure that improvements happen quickly and effectively
- Governors should ask more demanding questions and check information first hand.

## 2. Behaviour and safety of pupils are good

Areas for improvement:

No key areas identified in the report

## 3. Quality of teaching is good

Areas for improvement:

- Need to provide more consistent challenges for the most able
- Improve consistency of effective marking
- Need to increase expectation of parents to support learning

## 4. Achievement of pupils is good

Areas for improvement:

- Improve outcomes in KS1 phonics
- Improve attendance at parents evenings (above 87%) and increase expectations of parents March parents evening attendance was 93% (+6%)

## 5. Early Years provision is good

Areas for improvement:

- Improve opportunities for development of language and literacy in outdoor provision
- Improve achievement of boys in early years
- Use assessments more effectively to plan appropriate activities
