'Help your child to read' Workshops for Reception and Nursery Parents



Learning to read and write is probably one of the most important things your child will do in Reception and Nursery, and parents can help at home too. Mrs Patel will be holding a parent workshop on **Wednesday 18**th **January 2017 from 9:00 – 10:00 am** in the Oak Suite to share what we do in school and how you can help at home.

Phonics is the approach to teaching children the letter sounds that make up the words, then 'blending' them together to read and write. Come along after dropping your children off at school and see how you can support Phonics and Reading at home. There will be a crèche available for younger siblings. More workshops will be scheduled for future weeks.

New Boiler

You will have noticed that major works have begun by Woodcroft's main entrance as our ageing boilers are being replaced. This work is scheduled to continue up to the February half term. While the new boilers are being installed we will be having a temporary boiler sited along the front pathway adjacent to the hall.
