













World Book Day Vouchers and Book Fair

Parents Governors Needed for Woodcroft

Our current parent governors have done an excellent job supporting the school. However, several of their terms of office are coming to an end. Vacancies will therefore exist for three Parent Governors on the Governing Body. Letters were sent out about this yesterday.

All schools in England have a Governing Body which is responsible for overseeing many of the decisions in the school. It is a key role. Governors are needed to monitor, support, challenge, ask questions and ultimately to represent the school community. Governors help develop the school's ethos to ensure it maintains the highest standards.

The Governing Body works in close partnership with the headteacher, staff and the local authority. Whilst the headteacher is, of course, responsible for the day to day running of the school, the governors are involved with such things as staffing, curriculum, school buildings and finance.

If you wish to seek nomination as an elected Parent Governor, please collect a nomination form from the School Office. This form should be completed, with the accompanying personal statement of no more than 150 words, and returned to the Headteacher **no later than 12 noon on THURSDAY 1 MARCH 2018.**
