Topic Information: 'You, Me and Everyone'

We have planned a range of activities that will enable your child to develop more of an understanding of themselves and others. Children will begin by exploring their different senses and develop a deeper understanding of feelings and emotions and how to manage them.

We will be encouraging the children to become more confident and independent. Helping them to believe in themselves and take on new challenges.

General Information

- Uniform: Children need to wear full school uniform. Please name everything!
- Weather: Please dress your child for the weather. Children spend part of their day outdoors so as the winter weather sets in a warm, waterproof coat, gloves, hat and scarf are recommended.
- Someone Else Collecting: We are unable to let your child go home with someone else unless you tell us beforehand.

- Homework: Homework is sent home fortnightly. It supports what children have been learning in school. Please support your child to complete their homework.
- Class Teddy: Children will get the opportunity to take home our class bear. Please involve him in your daily routine, write a little and add a photo to his diary to be shared with the class.
- Cooking Money: We request a voluntary contribution of £10 per child for the term (roughly £1.00 / week). This can be paid online through 'School Money' and contributes towards the cost of extra cooking and sensory ingredients that are essential to enrich the curriculum.

Curriculum Information

<u>Reading</u>

Children will begin to bring home reading books on Mondays, Wednesday's and Friday's. Please spend time hearing and supporting your child to read and then comment in the HomeLink Book.

Phonics

<u>Writing</u>

The children will be encouraged to have a go at writing independently through a range of mark-making and writing activities. Handwriting practice takes place daily and is also visited during the daily phonics lesson. Your children will soon begin to form simple words.

<u>Maths</u>

This term we will focus on recognising small quantities of objects (0-10) and matching them to the corresponding numerals. We will be using mathematical language to explain our reasoning, as well as describing shapes and simple patterns.
