The Anti-Bullying Alliance published a report outlining young people's recommendations urging everyone to remember that 'Change Starts with Us!' This underlines how everyday acts like listening, thinking about the impact of our words or not 'liking' a hurtful social media post, can all help to reduce bullying. Over three quarters (76%) children highlighted that change should start with social media and gaming platforms. 73% of children also said that all adults needed to do more to tackle these problems.

Young people's recommendations include:

- Social media and online gaming companies should set children's privacy settings to the highest level.
- Media and influencers should use their power responsibly and portray real life
- Parents and carers should attempt to understand the technology that children use, and take time to listen to children.
- Government should act as role models in how they treat each other
- Children and young people should think about the impact of their words and actions.

Year 3 Project - Woodcroft Billboard Exhibition



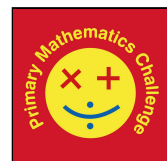
