Site Opening and Access Times



Can we remind all parents about site opening and access times. These arrangements are to ensure all pupils are safe on site.

At the start of the school day:

- The back entrance is <u>NOT</u> opened until <u>8.30am</u>
- All Breakfast Club pupils must arrive via front Main Entrance from 8.00am.
- Only Breakfast Club children will be allowed into the school building at 8.00am
- All other children and parents will **NOT** be allowed into the school building until 8.30am
- 8.30am: General access to the site via Back Entrance and Main Front Entrance
- 8.45am: The KS2/Y6 Front Door opens for access.
- 8.45am: Foundation Stage opens for access
- 8.55am: Registration bell rings: All doors and gates are now locked. Access via front entrance buzzer.

The end of the school day:

- 3.15pm All entrances open for access
- 3.30pm All entrances locked (Access after 3.30pm via buzzer at Main Front Entrance only)
- 4.15pm Main Front Entrance opens for collection from clubs (No access via any other entrance)

 Please note: For security and safeguarding reasons parents and carers are not allowed to wait inside the school building.
- 4.30 All doors locked (School Closed)


If any club or activity is advertised to finish after 4.30pm the adults in charge will supervise dismissal from the main front entrance as appropriate.

Nursery Access via Foundation Stage Entrance:

- 11.45am Foundation Stage is Open for Morning Nursery Collection
- 12.15pm Foundation Stage is Open for Afternoon Nursery Arrival

Acorns After-School Club:

Please collect children from the Oak Suite Entrance if they are attending Acorns. The main office is closed after 4.15pm.





If you need to contact the school regarding collection arrangements for your child can you please ensure this is done as early as possible, and well before the end of the school day. We have had an increasing number of parents calling at 3.15pm to pass on messages. Please understand that this is a busy time and classes are already on the playground. Office Staff cannot leave the office unsupervised to pass on late messages.

Please also remember that the Office closes at 4.15pm so all messages left after that time will not be dealt with until after 9.00am the following day.
