School Money Is Now Working Again!



Lock-Up Your Bikes and Scooters



We encourage pupils to walk or ride their bikes and scooters to school. We provide a bike shelter and scooter rack for older pupils at the front of school, and Scooter Pods for Nursery and Reception. However, all bikes and scooters need to

be locked safely. Parents MUST provide children their own bike chain or a padlock for their scooter - we do not accept responsibility for bikes and scooters while on school property.

We also expect children to wear a helmet when riding a bike to school and to lock their own bikes up in the shelter. Parents and carers are welcome to supervise younger riders on their journey to school.

Punctuality - try to arrive by 8.55am



Now that we have established the new routines of school could we ask that pupils arrive by 8.55am. This is our official registration time. Gates will still remain open until 9.00am, however teachers would like to be able to start lessons promptly at 9.00am. To enable this to happen, children need to arrive in good time to hang up coats, wash hands and sort their equipment for the start of the school day.

Woodcroft is a Barnet Local Authority school. We are visited every two weeks by our Education Welfare Officer (EWO). The EWO reviews pupil attendance and punctuality. This year our EWO is called Rosana Hermosa. She has written to introduce herself below.

Woodcroft Welcomes a new Educational Welfare Officer

Hello,

My name is Rosana Hermosa and I am the new Education Welfare Officer for Woodcroft Primary School. I work alongside Woodcroft staff to support attendance and punctuality and identify pupils who fall below the **97% attendance** expected by the school and Barnet's Education Welfare Team for children to achieve their educational potential. When a child falls below 90% attendance they are considered a persistent absentee by the Borough of Barnet. I have a duty to secure children's education and ensure attendance is kept to expectations. If your child falls below these expectations, or has unauthorised absences on their record, I will invite you to a meeting to discuss the reasons.

When reasons are not valid there are a range of Sanctions used by the Education Welfare Team. These include:

- Education Supervision Orders
- Fixed Penalty Notices
- Prosecution at Magistrates' Court

Please remember that all absences during term time must be authorised by the school. Term time holidays are never permitted.

Fixed-penalty Notices are also issued for unauthorised lateness to school. Parents and carers need to be aware that arrival to school after the official close of the register, without good reason, is recorded as an unauthorised absence and will affect attendance figures. Under the Local Authority's revised code of conduct concerning Fixed-Penalty Notices, this could result in the imposition of a penalty notice.

The absence is coded in the register as unauthorised late and each parent will receive a separate Penalty Notice for each child taken out of school, under the Education (Penalty Notices) (England) Regulations 2004.

The fine is £60 per parent per child if paid within 21 days of issue, otherwise the penalty notice will be £120 per parent per child. If the notice remains unpaid after the 28th day, the Local Authority will prosecute the parent(s) in the Magistrates' Court. If found guilty, parents will have a criminal record, and can be fined up to £1000.

If you are concerned about your own child's attendance please speak to the school or ask to arrange a meeting with me.

30 Hours FREE Childcare is available at Woodcroft Nursery



We still have a few places in our Nursery for this year. Contact the school office to Childcare discuss enrolling your child on our register. Children born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017 are eligible for a Nursery place at Woodcroft starting in September 2020.

Woodcroft offers the FREE flexible 15 hours provision for all children, with the option to pay for extra sessions as required. Parents of three and four year olds that are registered with Woodcroft's Nursery can also apply for the government's 30 hours free childcare offer through the Government website www.childcarechoices.gov.uk.

CLUB STARTS: Thursday 1st October 2020 (Sessions cannot be booked until a pupil has been registered)

REGISTRATION OPENS: Monday 28th September

We are now offering a limited number of places in our after school club for Woodcroft pupils. Parents will be able to register their child, and then book them into the club for either one hour at a cost of £7.50 per hour, per child, or two hours at a cost of £9.50 per child. A snack and soft drink will be included in the price. While these prices represent an increase from last term they are still very competitive with other after school clubs being run in this area. The increase is due to the need to limit places to ensure it is COVID secure. The school does not make a profit from Acorns.

To ensure social distancing we are moving the club away from the Oak Suite and into the dining room area. This will allow year group bubbles to play apart from each other. They will have access to the KS1 playground and other spaces on certain evenings.

Collection will now be from the back entrance of the school in Wolsey Grove and at two specified allocated times of 4:30pm and 5:30pm. If you arrive later than the time you have specified; you will be charged for the full evening at £9.50.

If any child fails to comply with the social distancing guidelines and puts the other children and Acorns staff at risk, you will be contacted and asked to collect them from the club immediately.

If you are interested in your child attending Acorns After School Club they will need to be added to this term's register. To do this, please contact the school by telephone, or e-mail. If you have any questions call the office and ask to speak with Mrs Hurley, an Acorns Co-ordinator, and we will gladly give you any further information you require. Please note, due to restrictions placed upon us, sessions can now only be booked and paid for one week in advance via the School Money system online. You will need to book your child's sessions by Friday for the next week.

We only have a limited number of slots available. The maximum number of places available for each session is 16. Should the demand for spaces exceed this availability then priority provision will be allocated to the children of key workers.

As before, your child will be collected from class at the end of the day by one of our Acorns staff, on the days that they attend the club. Children will still get involved in a variety of activities, including: multi-sports, art and crafts and games. Your child will learn new skills whilst enjoying themselves, in a safe and secure environment.

What next:

- 1. If you are interested in your child attending Acorns After-School Club please register by calling the school office and speaking with **Mrs Hurley**, your Acorns Co-ordinator.
- 2. Once registered you will be able to book sessions in advance using School Money
- 3. The charges are as follows:

3:30 - 4:30pm = £7.50 (1 hour)

3:30 - 5:30pm = £9.50 (Full session)

- 4. All bookings for the next week MUST be made by Friday at 4.30pm. Places will be strictly limited to 16 pupils..
- 5. Mid week bookings for the same week will not be available.
- 6. If you arrive after the allocated time you will be charged £2.00
- 7. Refreshments are included in the price.
- 8. Collection is now via the Back Gate in Wolsey Grove (Not the main entrance)

'VIRTUAL' PARENT EVENINGS FOR CHILDREN IN YEARS 1 TO 6

Dear Parents/Carers

We are holding parent consultation evenings for Parents and Carers on **Tuesday 6**th **October** and **Thursday 8**th **October 2020**. This will be an opportunity for you to discuss your child's progress with the classteacher.

How will it work?

- 3. The class teacher will schedule your 5 minute appointment and send you an email notification.
- 4. At the allotted time on the night click the link and join the meeting with your child's teacher.

Please note, timings will be strictly adhered to. If you are not available at your allotted appointment time then the class teacher will not be able to discuss your child with you.

You will also be asked to indicate if you have other children at Woodcroft Primary School and which class they are in so that we can coordinate your appointments.
