# Woodcroft AIM Values



At Woodcroft we encourage children to adopt a core set of values. We call these our **AIM Values** because we believe that having <u>A</u>spirations and <u>I</u>nspiration <u>M</u>atters in life. That is why we strive to enrich and extend the curriculum through our **AIM** Programmes (AIM Digital Technology, AIM PE & Sports and AIM Arts).

Covid currently restricts our capacity to provide extra-curricular activities at the moment and our focus is about ensuring classroom learning is as consistent, and disruption free as possible. As restrictions ease, and life returns to normal, we may begin to increase our extra activities. However, I am sure you will understand that events will be significantly curtailed during the summer term.

## Ramadan



Ramadan began on the evening of Monday 12th April and will end on Tuesday 11th May. Muslims fast between dawn and sunset and devote themselves to their faith. After the last day of Ramadan, Muslims celebrate it's ending with Eid al-Fitr, the Festival of Breaking the Fast. At Woodcroft we recognise the importance of Ramadan and aim to fully support our Muslim pupils during this holiest of months.

#### Fasting

Some of our older KS2 pupils may be fasting on certain days while at school. We require a letter from parents to inform the school of the days that their child will be fasting.

#### Praver

We offer a supervised separate space for girls and boys to pray at lunchtime. We expect all children when observing prayer to be responsible and impeccably behaved.

#### Lessons

We expect all pupils to take part in every school lesson and activity. If an aspect of the lesson proves difficult for a child due to religious observance then the teacher will modify aspects of their participation. For example, pupils may help the teacher during PE instead of doing vigorous exercise, or they will only listen to a music lesson. Children cannot be withdrawn from National Curriculum lessons

#### **Events**

If a specific event is taking place such as a school trip or sports match, although this will be very rare this year due to the pandemic, we may ask that an older child has their parents' approval to break a fast on that day to enable them to take part.

Now is the time to reserve your place in our Nursery ready for this September. Contact the school office to discuss enrolling your child on our register. Children born between 1st September 2017 and 31st August 2018 are eligible for a Nursery place at Woodcroft starting in September 2021.

Thank you to everyone who responded to our survey - we had a fantastic response. As a result we have now reopened Acorns!

#### **Updated Pricing**

We listened to your feedback and have revised our arrangements to make the services as cost effective as possible. However, to make it viable, and keep running, we will need at least 12 children per session to cover our costs. For one hour until 4.30pm it will cost £5.00 per child, or for two hours until 5.30pm it will be £8.00 per child.

#### **Book Using School Money**

Parents who have previously registered will be now able to book sessions. If you would like to register your child for the first time you will need to call the school office so that we can add you to the booking page.

To ensure space for social distancing the club moved away from the Oak Suite and into the dining room area.

Due to Early Years staffing ratios we will only be able to accept pupils of statutory school age from Reception to Year 6. Unfortunately, we cannot accept children from Nursery.

Collection will now be from the back entrance of the school in Wolsey Grove and at two specified allocated times of 4:30pm and 5:30pm.

Should the demand for spaces exceed this availability then priority provision will be allocated to the children of key workers.

#### What to do next

- 1. Pre registered pupils can now book sessions (call the office if you can't see Acorns on School Money listed under clubs)
- 2. New children must be added to the Acorns register by calling the school office first
- 3. All sessions must be booked in advance using School Money
- 4. The charges are as follows:
  - 3:30 4:30pm = £5.00 (1 hour) 3:30 – 5:30pm = £8.00 (Full session)
- 5. If you collect after your allocated time you will be charged the additional £3.00 Full Session price
- 6. Light refreshments are included in the price (but this is not a meal)
- 7. Collection is via the back gate in Wolsey Grove (Not the main front entrance)

## The BIG Ask

Woodcroft will be taking part in the largest ever survey in England of young people.
