Reading

Books get changed every <u>Tuesday & Friday</u>

- Read aloud every night for 15 minutes.
- · Make sure your child gets lots of practise reading.
- Home Link Book (Please make sure these are signed and kept in bookbags)
- Ask questions to improve your child's understanding of the text

What do you think this book will be about?

Have you read any other books by this author?









Phonics

In Year 1 children will move onto phase 5 phonics, while continuing to recap phases 2, 3 and 4.

We will begin to learn the alternative spellings and pronunciations for different sounds eg:

Rain, came, day, acorn









The phonics screening check is a short, light-touch assessment to confirm whether individual children have learnt phonic decoding to an appropriate standard. It will identify the children who need extra help so they are given support by their school to improve their reading skills.










Arbor Parent Portal





You are now able to make online payments and see your child's information through the Arbor portal.

Most parents have already registered to access their account. Reminder emails have been sent to everyone who still needs to log on. If you have not registered, please check your inbox and junk folders for the welcome emails from Arbor.

The Arbor system will be used for Email, Messaging, Assessment Information, Behaviour Reports and now **Cashless Payments**. All this from one convenient and secure login!

IMPORTANT NOTE: The first time you log on you will need to use a computer, laptop or tablet.
