Reusable Water Bottles



Can we remind parents and carers to ensure your child has a reusable water bottle. These need to be washed and re-filled before school every day. Please note, we do not provide children with water bottles if they are forgotten or lost. Make sure your child's bottle is clearly named.

No Disposables Bottles Please

We do not allow disposable bottles in school. Not only are these bad for the environment, but they are also not durable enough for repeated refilling and become very noisy to drink from in a quiet classroom!

Pupil Premium Funding: Do you qualify?



School budgets have been significantly cut in recent years. Did you know that we are also partly funded through the Government's Pupil Premium Grant. Schools receive an extra **£1345** for every pupil who is eligible so it is vital that the school knows who qualifies.

We cannot claim this extra funding unless we register all eligible families. Unfortunately, we are <u>NOT</u> told who qualifies – we rely on parents informing the school.

You are eligible for Pupil Premium if you receive any of the following:

- > Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400
- > Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- > The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- > Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190

In these times of drastic cuts to school budgets it is essential that Woodcroft receives the maximum funding. Please speak with our Office staff if you think you may qualify.

Attendance & Punctuality at Woodcroft

My name is Mrs Pun and I am the Education Welfare Officer for Woodcroft Primary School. I work alongside Woodcroft Primary to identify pupils who fall below the 97% attendance expected by the school and Barnet's Education Welfare Team for children to achieve their educational potential.

When a child falls below 90% attendance they are considered a persistent absentee by the borough of Barnet. I have a duty to secure children's education and ensure attendance is kept to expectations. If your child falls below these expectations, and/or has unauthorised absences on their record, I will invite you to a meeting to give an explanation for these absences. You will have the opportunity to explain reasons for absence and any family circumstances you consider important.

Sanctions used by the Education Welfare Team are:

- Education Supervision Orders
- Fixed Penalty Notices
- Prosecution at Magistrates' Court

Punctuality

Fixed-penalty Notices for Unauthorised lateness to school

Parents need to be aware that arrival to school after the official close of the register, without good reason, is recorded as an unauthorised absence and will affect attendance figures. Under the Local Authority's revised code of conduct concerning Fixed-Penalty Notices, this could result in the imposition of a penalty notice.

The absence is coded in the register as unauthorised late and each parent, much like term time holidays, will receive a separate Penalty Notice for each child taken out of school, under the Education (Penalty Notices) (England) Regulations 2004.

The fine is £60 per parent per child if paid within 21 days of issue, otherwise the penalty notice will be £120 per parent per child. If the notice remains unpaid after the 28th day, the Local Authority will prosecute the parent(s) in the Magistrates' Court. If found guilty, parents will have a criminal record, and can be fined up to £1000.

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Access all your info in one

We are putting everything for parents in one place within the **Arbor Parent Portal.**

You are now able to make online payments and see your child's information through the Arbor portal.

Most parents have already registered to access their account. Reminder emails have been sent to everyone who still needs to log on. If you have not registered, please check your inbox and junk folders for the welcome emails from Arbor.

The Arbor system will be used for Email, Messaging, Assessment Information, Behaviour Reports and now **Cashless Payments**. All this from one convenient and secure login!

IMPORTANT NOTE: The first time you log on you will need to use a computer, laptop or tablet.

Parents who have done this already report that it is quick and easy. However, some phones do not allow you to press the 'accept terms' button because of their screen size. However, once this is done for the first time they say that it is easy to login using your phone.

You can also download the Arbor App from the Google Play Store or the Apple App Store to easily log in to your school account.

As the school receives brochures and posters, they will be distributed or added to the Weekly News.


Note to Year 5 parents:

Nasal Flu Vaccinations Available For ALL Woodcroft Pupils

We have had a number of parents enquire about this year's flu vaccinations programme. Please note the information below.

Firstly, can I confirm that no child will ever be administered medication at school without a parent's FULL consent.

The nasal flu vaccination date for Woodcroft is Monday **11th October 2021**. This is intended for every primary school aged children from Reception to Year 6 (Nursery aged children will receive it via their GP service)

The children's flu vaccine is safe and effective. It's offered every year as a nasal spray to children to help protect them against flu. (Note: A vegan/halal version is available via injection can be requested via the consent form)

Flu is caused by a virus. It can be a very unpleasant illness for children. It can also lead to serious problems, such as bronchitis and pneumonia. Children spread the flu easily. Vaccinating them also protects others who are vulnerable to the flu, such as babies and older people.

Do not let children take electronic devices into bedrooms, say doctors

The UK's chief medical officers issued advice to parents to help them manage their children's use of technology

When we surveyed our pupils we were surprised by the number who had access to devices and screens in their bedrooms after they were sent to bed. Research shows that children aged 6 to 12 years old need between 9 and 12 hours of good sleep as part of a regular bedtime routine.

At Woodcroft we advise that children should have all devices <u>removed</u> from their bedroom at night e.g. phones, tablets, gaming consoles and laptops!
